PROGRAMME INFORMATION

AIM OF THE PROGAMME

To prepare registered nurses to provide community-based primary health care services with quality & standards for clients.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PROGRAMME

To strengthen the competencies of registered nurses in delivering community-based primary health care services.

DESIGN OF THE PROGRAMME

The programme is designed based on the expected scope of services of nurses working in various primary health care settings in the community. The scope of services involve three levels of preventive care as specified below:

1. At primary preventive level

- Life Course Preventive Care to advocate healthy lifestyle and facilitate living environment conducive to total well-being
- Educational programmes, advisory and counseling services to drive lifestyle changes
- Initial health assessment for chronic disease risk factors including overweight / obesity, fall risk and lifestyle risk behavior such as smoking, alcohol consumption, unhealthy diet, physical inactivity

2. At secondary preventive level

- ➤ Health assessment and risk screening
- ➤ Early identification of risk factors related to chronic diseases
- > Appropriate referral and follow-up
- Management of uncomplicated chronic disease to prevent complications

3. At tertiary preventive level

Community rehabilitation for improvement of functional capacity, independence and total well-being

PROGRAMME OBJECTIVES AND INTENDED LEARNING OUTCOMES(PILO)

Aim:

To enhance understanding of professional nurses about their roles in primary health care, and equip them with competencies in providing community-based primary health care.

The specific objectives of the training programme are:

- ➤ To enhance knowledge, skills, and attitudes of registered nurses in providing community-based primary health care services.
- To apply the competencies using evidence and innovative approaches in providing community-based primary health care services.

Upon completion of the programme, participants should be able to:

- PILO1 Apply community health, public health and primary health care concepts and models, mobilise health and social resources in the delivery of nursing services in community-based primary health care.
- PIL02 Conduct initial health assessment for clients with chronic diseases to identify risk factors (e.g. overweight / obesity, fall risk) and lifestyle risk behavior (e.g. smoking, binge drinking, physical inactivity).
- PILO3 Conduct continuous comprehensive health assessment and risk screening for clients with chronic diseases and other health problems to monitor progress and make referrals as appropriate.
- PILO4 Provide health promotion, counselling and educational programmes to increase health literacy, advocate healthy life style and drive lifestyle changes for the prevention of chronic diseases.
- PILO5 Implement appropriate nursing and non-pharmacological interventions including health communication, counselling, health coaching, motivational interview to empower individuals, families/carers for self-care management.
- PILO6 Act as a care coordinator, collaborate with multi-disciplinary professional team and mobilise health and social resources to provide comprehensive care and support to clients requiring primary health care at primary, secondary and tertiary level.

DURATION OF THE PROGRAMME

05 October 2024 - 08 February 2025

DESIGN OF THE PROGRAMME

This course is designed with a combination of theory and clinical visit, which is organized and conducted by the The Hong Kong Academy of Nursing & Midwifery (HKANM) & The Hong Kong College of Community and Public Health Nursing (HKCCPHN).

A. Theoretical part

The theory part composes of 4 main components:

- 1. Concepts of primary health care and care coordination
- 2. Structured, Protocol-driven interventions
- 3. Individual based interventions
- 4. Condition-specific management update

The first component provides the learner an overall concept of primary health care and care coordination, setting the scene for the delivery of community-based primary health care. The second component discusses structured protocol-driven interventions delivered among aggregates of clients with similar needs to promote primary health care. The third component teaches specific non-pharmacological individual-based interventions in equipping learners with competence to promote health mainly at primary and secondary levels. The fourth component targets at furnishing the learners with the most updated and evidence-based management approach for clients that require specific chronic disease management and rehabilitation.

The teaching content, hours and learning & teaching activities are displayed as follows:
